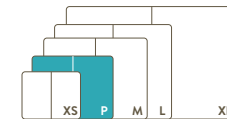


Myhometown | The voids of the war

This itinerary begins near the house of an old headmistress of a primary school. Known affectionately as *la vecchia* (the old lady), she often told about her afternoon of mid August 1943 at the *sanctuary of San Celso* when allied bombers dropped thousands of bombs on the city. We begin in piazzale di *porta Ludovica* at the **patisserie Gattullo** (short distance by tram from the yellow metro line Missori). On the front door to the right of the patisserie, the wording **US** and **R** refer to the emergency exits and air raid shelter respectively.

Beyond the small green area, in the brown tile building is where **la vecchia's house** once was. Despite the bombs, remained quite intact but was demolished after the war. Let's take *corso Italia* up towards *via Molino dell'Armi* which we turn on to: the green space along *via Campo Lodigiano* we see the partial remains of a house leaning against the adjacent building. The bombs turned all of the buildings to rubble between here and the **parco delle Basiliche**.
